Alberta Indigenous Green Employment

(AIGEP)

- \$2.5 million
- Facilitates training in Green economy through Aboriginal Skills Employment and Training Strategy (ASETS) agreement holders
- Supports employment and training projects in:
 - The transition to a lower carbon economy
 - Promotes low carbon economy employment

Indigenous Climate Leadership Initiative 2017 / 18 TRANSITIONAL PROGRAMS


Available Now

These programs will provide Indigenous communites and organizations opportunity to participate in and benefit from \$35 million of funding for Indigenous Climate Leadership identified in Budget 2017 for this fiscal year. These programs will be available during the 2017/ 2018 year, while we explore options for a joint decision-making governance model for Indigenous Climate Leadership Initiative.

Eligible Applicants for Remaining Programs

- First Nation communities, Metis
 Nation of Alberta, Metis Settlements
 and Aseniwuche Winewak Nation.
- Indigenous Organizations:
 - Friendship Centres
 - Tribal Councils
 - Indigenous community-owned businesses
- Applicants must be located in Alberta.



Alberta Indigenous Climate Capacity Program (AICCP)

- \$2.5 million
- Builds technical and leadership capacity
 - Increase climate leadership knowledge
 - Empower communities for green-energy economic development opportunities
 - Shows communities how to make a real impact in reducing GHG

- Covers 100%
- Maximum of \$100,000 per application

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Eligible Activities and Expenses

Eligible Activities

- Climate Leadership Coordinators
- Indigenous climate leadership training sessions.
- Elder and youth climate awareness programs.
- Train-the-trainer sessions intended to increase local capacity in climate leadership program delivery.

Eligible Expenses

- Salary or contract costs to deliver or manage project
 - Admin costs, salary for new or expanded positions
- Travel expenses for project participants
- Project and training supplies
- Enrollment fees
 - Tuition, course costs, etc.



Alberta Indigenous Climate Planning (AICPP) **Program**

- \$2.5 million
- Goals:
 - Improve energy efficiency
 - Reduce greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions
 - Drive economic development.

Purpose:

- Provide energy inventories
- Forecast community energy use and needs
- Develop energy and emission reduction targets
- Target actions and timelines for implementation
- Enable greater participation in a low-carbon economy

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AICPP Project Types

AICPP provides funding to support two types of initiatives:

- Community Energy Plans: (must include)
 - Baseline study of a communities current energy use and generation
 - Projections of future energy needs
 - Plan to support current and future energy needs while reducing GHGs
- Clean Energy Opportunities Assessments: (must include)
 - Community energy profile
 - Feasibility assessments of potential community clean energy projects



Funding Mechanisms

- Covers 100% of eligible expenses
- Maximum of \$100,000 per community / organization
- Maximum of 1 application per community
- 50% of total project costs must be spent in community

Applications must demonstrate how community will be engaged





Alberta Indigenous Community Energy Program (AICEP)

- \$3 million
- Supports opportunities to save energy and money



- Assesses efficiency of existing buildings
- Supports community decision making
- Estimates energy savings and greenhouse gas reductions

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What is a 'Detailed Energy Assessment'?

A building analysis completed by a qualified professional (P.Eng, CEM or CEA) to ASHRAE Level II audit guidelines

- Includes:
 - Description and state of repair of building(s)
 - Review of mechanical/electrical systems and building envelope, windows, etc.
 - Analysis of energy consumption in the building
 - Listing of existing operating and maintenance problems
 - Proposed modifications to equipment and operations that will result in energy/cost savings
 - Preparation of a business case for implementation of proposed building retrofits



Projects Eligible for AICEP

Types of projects funded:

- Office and administrative buildings
- Fire halls and police stations
- Elders' Centres
- Any other community owned buildings
- Buildings must be owned by the community itself, or by a community-owned business or organization

Ineligible Projects:

- Buildings operated by a for-profit business or organization not owned by the Indigenous community
- Privately-owned residential buildings
- Provincially or federally operated buildings located on Indigenous community lands



Alberta Indigenous Energy Efficiency Retrofit Program (AIEERP)

- \$14 million
- Improve energy efficiency and reduce greenhouse gas emissions
- Provides 100% of expenses per project
- up to a maximum of \$1 million

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Project Types and Criteria

Retrofits

- Non-residential buildings to be assessed using the Detailed Energy Assessment Requirements (DEAR)
- Assessment must be conducted by a qualified auditor.
- GHG reduction must be demonstrated.

New Builds

- GHG avoidance must be clearly demonstrated.
- Information on upgrades and cost savings must be presented.





Alberta Indigenous Solar Program (AISP)

- \$3 million
- Supports communities investing in solar energy infrastructure by:
 - Funding solar photovoltaic (PV) systems on facilities owned by the community or organization

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Funding Levels

- Funding is available up to 80% of eligible expenses up to a maximum of \$200,000 per project, per community/organization.
- Applicants can access other non-Government of Alberta funded programs to cover the remaining 20% of the project costs.
- Maximum funding stacking is 100 % of costs



Eligible Projects

 Solar panel installations greater than or equal to 2 kilowatts (kW) and less than 1 megawatt (MW) in capacity

 Projects completed and energized after June 29, 2017

 Projects compliant with Alberta's Micro-Generation Regulation (AR 27/2008)





Alberta Indigenous Green Energy Development Program (AIGEDP)

- \$8 million
- Development of commercial-scale, renewable-energy projects

- Activities funded:
 - Project Development
 - Project Implementationindigenous.alberta.ca/AIGEDP





Funding Levels per Activity

- Project Development: \$3 million total funding
 - \$60,000: This includes a pre-feasibility stage
 - \$550,000: Includes feasibility, regulatory, environmental studies, business plans.





Funding Levels per Activity

- Project Implementation: \$5 million total funding
 - No funding cap.
 - Assessed by third party contractor
 - Renewable energy must be sold into Alberta's energy grid system

Must adhere to Alberta Utility Commission Guidelines on Distributed
 Generation or the Alberta Electric System Operator's full participant
